Regular Office Hours

7 days per week, 24 hours per day Central Time (CT)

Hours of Service for Entrance and Clearance

Inspection services for the entrance/ arrival of seaplanes only at Oak Island Seaplane Base are available 7 days per week, 0800-2300 CT in accordance with the port's permission to land procedures.

Commercial aircraft operators departing the U.S. must obtain an outbound clearance by contacting CBP directly.

Permission to Land Procedures

Pilots must secure permission to land by contacting CBP in Warroad, MN prior to departure from the foreign port or place and at least 2 hours in advance of the anticipated arrival time at Oak Island Seaplane Base.

Permission to land is granted with a tolerance of (+/-) 30 minutes. If your ETA deviates outside those parameters, Previously granted permission(s) are invalid and you must contact CBP to re-secure permission to land.

Inspection Process

- An electronic APIS manifest must be filed for all private and commercial aircraft arrivals and departures in accordance with current regulations and procedures.
- Seaplane operators must land at Oak Island and utilize the CBP ROAM application to complete arrival processes.
- The ROAM application is authorized for seaplane operator use only at limited locations. The use of ROAM for other private and commercial general aviation aircraft is not authorized.

Special Procedures/Miscellaneous

- Only seaplanes are processed at this location.
- Seaplanes must land on the water, remain on the water, and not drive onto land.
